PROFILE OF INTERNATIONAL HOSPITAL SCHOOL OF NURSING

International Hospital School of Nursing was established in the year 2009. The first and second batch of students from the school came out successfully in 2013 and 2014 and all of them were absorbed as Staff Nurses by International Hospital, the parent hospital of the school.

The School is recognised by the Indian Nursing Council (School code: 0402022) and the Assam Nurses', Midwives' and Health Visitors' Council.

The School has been set up to inculcate human values, to provide contemporary knowledge, and impart skill thereby creating employment opportunities to young men and women in the profession of Nursing. The teaching programme of the School is a good blend of theory and practice. The theory classes are delivered by highly qualified and experienced faculty members and guest experts in best of its class infrastructure that includes comfortable class rooms, modern audio-visual equipments including several manikins and simulators & teaching aids, demonstration rooms, anatomy models and charts etc. For practical experience, the student nurses are taken to different health care organizations with varied health care delivery systems. Student nurses are also given exposure to comprehensive community health care delivery system, both the urban and rural system.

PROFILE OF INTERNATIONAL HOSPITAL (THE PARENT HOSPITAL OF THE SCHOOL)

Established in the year 1999, inaugurated by late *Surabala Bordoloi*, wife of late *Bharat Ratna Gopinath Bordoloi*, International Hospital today has earned a name and fame across the country in patient care especially in the disciplines of Nephrology, Gastroenterology, Urology, Paediatrics, Paediatric Surgery, Neurosciences, high end Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Surgery, Laparoscopic surgeries apart from all other supporting disciplines.

Within a span of a decade and half, International Hospital has grown by nearly 5 times in terms of bed strength; in 2010, the Hospital developed the capability to conduct **Kidney Transplantation** and the number of transplantations has already crossed hundred and the number is growing every month.

The Hospital has established a CATHLAB and Heart Command Centre in association with Fortis Escorts Healthcare Institute. A plan is also underway to develop the Hospital to a full-fledged Super Specialty Tertiary Health Care Organization in collaboration with a flagship Healthcare Institution of International presence in the near future.

After completion of Diploma level programme, a competent student may pursue graduate, post-graduate and doctorate level courses in a variety of clinical and social disciplines.

- ❖ International Hospital School of Nursing recognises National Health Goals and is committed to participate in the implementation of National Health Policies and Programmes.
- ❖ International Hospital School of Nursing aims at identifying health needs of the people, planning and providing quality care in collaboration with other health professionals and community groups.
- ❖ Scope of nursing practice encompasses provision of promotive, preventive, curative and rehabilitative aspects of care to people across their life span in wide variety of health care settings.
- ❖ Practice of nursing is based upon application of basic concepts and principles derived from physical, biological, behavioural, spiritual and medical sciences.





- ❖ Nursing is based on values of caring. The profession aims to help individuals to attain independence in self-care. Therefore, the students need development of compassion for and understanding of human behaviour, respect for life, dignity and rights of patients.
- ❖ It is the prime responsibility of the teachers to create a congenial environment for learning so that the students acquire knowledge, skills, aptitude and a positive attitude for serving the humanity.

OBJECTIVES OF THE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME ON GENERAL NURSING & MIDWIFERY (GNM)

The principal objective of this three year Diploma programme on General Nursing and Midwifery of International Hospital School of Nursing is to empower young men and women with minimum higher secondary qualification to pursue a professional career in nursing education. Upon completion of the course it is expected that the students would achieve the following:

1. Ability to apply knowledge from physical, biological, behavioural and medical sciences in providing nursing care to individuals, families and communities;
2. Ability to transfer understanding of life style and related factors that affect health of individuals and groups;
3. Ability to provide nursing care to recuperating, critically ill and terminally ill patients;
4. Develop skills of critical thinking in making decisions in handling difficult situations while giving care to patients;
5. Ability to grasp knowledge and skill in operating of the new generation medical equipments;
6. Ability to provide promotive, preventive and restorative health services in line with the National Health Policies and Programmes;
7. Ability to practice within the framework of Code of Ethics and Professional Conduct and acceptable standards of practice within the legal boundaries;





8. Acquire skill of effective communication with individuals and groups and members of health team in order to promote sustained interpersonal relationship and team spirit;
9. Acquire skill sets to teach individuals and groups in clinical/community health settings;
10. Ability to participate effectively as member of a health team in health care delivery system;
11. Ability to demonstrate leadership and managerial skill in clinical/community health settings;
12. Ability to conduct need based research studies in various settings and utilize the research findings to improve the quality of health care management system;
13. Develop awareness, interest for continual learning and skill development and thereby contribute towards development of self and the profession.

ADMISSION CRITERIA for General Nursing and Midwifery Diploma (GNM) Course

- ❖ Minimum educational qualification: Higher Secondary (12th Standard) in any discipline from any recognised Board with minimum aggregate marks of 40%.
- ❖ Physical and mental fitness: The applicant must be physically and mentally fit to undergo a rigorous class room and practical training of three year duration.
- ❖ Mode of obtaining application: The Prospectus and the Application Form can be obtained from the office of the International Hospital School of Nursing either in person or through post. Cost of the Prospectus and the Application Form is Rs. 500.00 only. For obtaining the same through post please send a Demand Draft of Rs.500.00 only drawn in favour of International Hospital School of Nursing payable at Guwahati along with a self-addressed envelop of size 8"x10" with postage of Rs. 25.00 fixed.
- ❖ Mode of application submission: The filled up application form must reach the office of the International Hospital School of Nursing on or before the last date of submission specified in the





Application Form. Incomplete application/ applications received after last date of submission shall not be considered. International Hospital School of Nursing shall not any way be responsible for delayed postal delivery. The following documents must be submitted along with the Application Form:

- Three self attested passport sized photograph of the applicant; one being pasted on the space provided in the Application Form;
 - One copy each of the HSLC (Class X)/ Higher Secondary (Class XII) mark sheets and pass certificates & admit card of class X and XII self-attested;
 - One copy of the certificate of the date of birth self-attested;
 - Character certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended;
 - Caste certificate from appropriate authority if the candidate belongs to SC, ST, OBC or any other reserved category;
 - Undertaking from the parent/legal guardian of the candidate promising to meet all financial obligations of the candidate during the training (If admitted).
 - Permanent Residential Certificate (PRC).
- ❖ Selection process: candidates short-listed after scrutiny of the Application Forms and testimonials submitted shall be called for a personal interview to be held at the International Hospital School of Nursing on a prescribed date. The date of interview shall be intimated to all short-listed candidates in advance. Original documents of all testimonials submitted along with the Application Form must be produced at the time of the interview. The Interview Board shall select the candidates based upon merit only and in this regard the decision of the Board shall be final and binding. Selected candidates shall be informed. Also the list of the selected candidates shall be displayed on the Notice Board of the International Hospital School of Nursing and posted on the web site of International Hospital.

- ❖ Security deposit : The Security Deposit of Rs. 2,000.00 taken at the time of admission shall be refunded without any interest accrued after deducting cost of damages caused by the student, if any after successful completion of the course.
- ❖ Enrollment fee, Examination fee and Registration fee shall be charged as prescribed by the State Nursing Council.
- ❖ Failure of the student to pay admission fee on the stipulated due date as fixed by the Management of the School might result in cancellation of admission of a selected candidate.
- ❖ Any student who drops out of the course after admission for whatsoever reason(s) shall be liable to bear the entire course fee for the three years period.
- ❖ Annual fees are to be paid at the time of admission to next year of the course.





DURATION OF COURSE

The Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery shall be of three years. However, if the duration of the course is increased by the council on any ground, then the institution will not bear the cost for extra period. This duration of the course is subjected to change.

Medium of Instruction : English, as nursing courses are technical.

VACATION & ATTENDANCE

- ❖ Students shall be granted 30 days vacation in each calendar year as per the Course Plan of the School. Vacation not availed when assigned shall be forfeited.
- ❖ The students shall be entitled to 10 days of Medical Leave (if sick) and 7 days of Study Leave (prior to examinations).
- ❖ Whenever a student leaves the premises of the School on account of vacations/leave or any other reason, parent/local guardian shall take full responsibility of their ward till return to the School.
- ❖ The students must commit to 'make up' the lost part of the training due to leave/absence during the course duration itself.
- ❖ 95% attendance in theory and 100% attendance in Clinical work is necessary for course completion.

Diploma by the Council/ Board will be issued only after the successful completion of the course.

EXAMINATIONS

First, second and final examinations are conducted by the Assam Nurses', Midwives and Health Visitors' Council. Pre-council tests are held by the School. Students who obtain minimum 50% marks in these test will be allowed to sit for the council examinations. Further, the standards of their achievement in class room assignment and clinical areas should also be satisfactory enough to sit for the council examination.

Supplementary Examinations

Council/ Board may hold supplementary examination after six months of the final examinations.

- If the student fails in theory papers she may be allowed to join the next year of study. However she will be required to appear for a supplementary examination held subsequently in the paper she has failed in, and it is mandatory that she clears all the failed subjects before appearing in the final examinations.
- Passing the Practical examination is compulsory for promotion to the next year of study.
- Relevant changes in the INC/SNC rules will be applicable to the International Hospital School of Nursing also.





STUDENT FACILITIES

- ❖ Hostel accommodation shall be provided to the female students only and female students must reside in the hostel. Male students shall require to arrange their own accommodation unless the School Management decides to provide the hostel facilities to them too.
- ❖ There shall be a common Hostel Mess. The Mess shall be managed by the Mess Staff under the overall direction and guidance of a Mess Committee constituted by the representatives of the students. The overall control of the management of the Mess shall rest with the Principal of the School.
- ❖ The School shall provide adequate library facilities to the students having access to reference books, national/ international journals, Internet facilities etc.
- ❖ The School shall provide facilities to the students for indoor & outdoor games and sports and other recreational activities to the extent the resources permit.
- ❖ Facilities provided for site seeing around the city, for visiting Educational Institutions meant for differently abled children and old age homes etc.
